The BYU Family Historian is an online academic journal. Authors should note that articles are peer reviewed. Please adhere to the following guidelines for article submission:

- 1. Follow the guidelines for manuscript preparation as detailed in The Chicago Manual of Style, 14th ed. (Chicago: University of Chicago Press, 1993), and Style Guide for Publications of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 3rd ed. (Salt Lake City: The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, 1998).
- 2. Submit one hard copy of the article along with one electronic copy of the article in Word or Word Perfect format either on an IBM formatted floppy disk or through e-mail to j_livingston@sisna.com (please limit attachment size to no larger than 1 MB). Include any image files or unique fonts used in the article.
- 3. Include a description of any images used along with source information and a short 3 5 line biography about the author.
