## LIBRARIANS

### Brown University

WEN-KAI KUNG has been appointed Curator of the East Asian Collection, Brown University, effective July 1, 1986. Dr. Kung has a Ph.D. in Asian Languages and Literature, an MLS from the University of Washington, and Masters degrees in history and international relations from the Universities of South Carolina and Pennsylvania. Dr. Kung has taught in the Asian language program at Seattle University. Recently Assistant Head of the African-Asian Section, Exchange and Gifts Division, at the Library of Congress, he previously served as Orientalia Collection Librarian at the University of Oregon, Chinese Bibliographer and Cataloger at Princeton University, and Specialist in Chinese and Japanese materials at the University of Washington Law Library.

### National Library of Australia

SIDNEY S. W. WANG, Chief Librarian, Orientalia, National Library of Australia, retired from this position on December 24, 1985. His successor has not been announced. A member of CEAL, Mr. Wang was also an active participant in the East Asian Librarians group of Australia, in which he served as editor of several issues of its Newsletter.

### Princeton University

CH'IU-KUEI WANG joined the staff of Gest Oriental Library and East Asian Collections on September 1, 1986, in the capacity of Chinese Bibliographer and Assistant Head, Collection Development and Public Services Section. A specialist in Chinese folklore and popular literature, Mr. Wang holds a Ph.D. degree from Cambridge University. Since 1969 he has taught at National Taiwan University where he also served as chair of the Department of Foreign Language and Literature. He is the author or editor of numerous publications.

### University of Washington

DING ZY-KAAN and WANG YUAN-HUA, computer experts from the Computer Center, Academia Sinica, Taipei (ASCC), were in residence from March to May 1986, at the East Asia Library, University of Washington, Seattle (UWEAL). The principal aims of their visit, agreed upon in advance by the above two joint sponsor institutions, were the following:

1. to establish a Chinese full-text processing system prototype, based on ASCC's automated Chinese history system, on a Micro VAX II at UWEAL;
2. to port the automated Chinese history log system's source data to the Micro VAX II; and
3. to design an integrated library system that will also fit the Academia Sinica Libraries' requirements.
