A Holdings List of the Present Non-Partisan Political Journals from Taiwan, 1980-

The aim of this report is to follow up my previous article, "A Review of the Present Non-Partisan Political Journals of Taiwan,"¹ in order to respond to the people who are interested in accessibility and preservation. The information in this holdings list is based on my "A Survey of the Present Non-Partisan Political Journals of Taiwan, 1980- " sent to the fourteen largest East Asian collections in the United States last August. From the different holdings in the libraries, we can sense their various acquisition situations. As was said some years ago, "From the discussion and criticism of current Taiwan domestic problems, articles on political affairs and the current social problems appearing in these magazines, we can sense the problems in Taiwan and anticipate its future. The value of such materials for the study of contemporary and future Taiwan is immense."² Because of the extent of censorship, a holdings list for a certain period is worthwhile, not only because it serves the purpose of sharing information, but also because it will benefit the scholarly world for future reference.

In my survey, there were ten titles listed; I asked that any title published after 1980 not shown be added. Thanks to all my conscientious colleagues, the following titles and information were mentioned:

- Ch'ien chin kuang ch'ang 前進廣場 (Progress). Weekly. January 1983-.
 Publisher: Ts'ai Shih-yüan; editor: Chang Fu-chung.
- Ch'ien chin shih tai 前進時代 (Progress). Weekly. January 1984-.
 Publisher: Ts'ai Jen-chien; editor: Chang Fu-chung.
- K'ai ch'uang 開創 (The new era). Monthly. July 1984-. Publisher: Huang Huang-hsiung.
- P'eng lai tao 蓬萊島 (Fabulous island). Weekly. June 1984-. Publisher: Huang T'ien-fu.
- Sheng keng 生根 (Roots). Weekly. November 1983-. Founder: Hsü Jung-shu; publisher: Hsü Kuo-tai; Editor: Lin Shih-yü.
- T'ai-wan nien tai 台灣年代 (Taiwan era). Weekly. January 1984-.
 Founder: Hsü Jung-shu; publisher: Hsü Kuo-tai; Editor: Lin Shih-yü.

As stated above besides K'ai ch'uang which is monthly, all other new magazines are weekly. During 1984 the Taiwan authorities censored, banned, confiscated or

suspended a number of magazines.³ The publishers have been able to get around this by immediately applying for a new license for a "new" magazine. Mrs. Chang Hsü Jung-shu, the publisher of Shen keng (Cultivation) applied to publish another Sheng keng (Roots; with the same sound and different characters and meaning) almost immediately following the one-year suspension of Cultivation. When in January 1984, the same situation happened with the new Sheng ken (Roots), a new title, T'ai-wan nien tai came out with the same sponsor and publishing team. The different measures of censorship in Taiwan, i.e. suspension, confiscation, and banning are unavoidable. Complete information on some titles is almost impossible to ascertain.
