Rating System

In order to convey quickly the overall quality of a book, a rating is located immediately under the grade level to the side of each review. The explanations of the ratings are:

- * Exceptional quality of merit. The asterisk is used sparingly and only in cases where the book deserves special recognition.
- A Excellence. Books which receive a rating of A will add strength to a library and should find wide acceptance among young readers.
- B Recommended for libraries which need additional books in a specific subject area. Generally books with a rating of B are dependable, if not outstanding.
- C Will have appeal for some readers despite significant shortcomings. Should be purchased only after careful consideration.
- NR Not Recommended.

Grade Level

The approximate *grade level* of the intended reader is identified in the margin. When the reviewer believes that a particular book will appeal to a wide range of readers, no upper limit is indicated. Many books, including picture books, find a favorable reader response far beyond the reading level indicated by the vocabulary, treatment of subject, or format.

Book Classification

Books are also given a two letter code, indicating the genre of the particular book.
