Rating System

In order to convey quickly the overall quality of a book, a rating appears in bold-face type after the bibliographical information.

- * Exceptional quality of merit. The asterisk is used sparingly and only in cases where the book deserves special recognition.
- A Excellence. Books which receive a rating of A will add strength to a library and should find wide acceptance among young readers.
- B Recommended for libraries which need additional books in a specific subject area. Generally books with a rating of B are dependable, if not outstanding.
- C Will have appeal for some readers despite significant shortcomings. Should be purchased only after careful consideration.

NR Not Recommended.

Grade Level

The approximate grade level of the intended reader appears immediately after the rating. When the reviewer believes that a particular book will appeal to a wide range of readers, no upper limit is indicated. Many books, including picture books, find a favorable reader response far beyond the reading level indicated by the vocabulary, treatment of subject, or format.

Book Classification

Book classification follows the grade level. Books are given a two letter code, indicating the genre of the particular book.
