Contributors to This Issue

Dorothy Burton Skårdal, a past contributor to *The Bridge*, is Senior Lecturer at the American Institute, Department of English, University of Oslo. She is a native of Nebraska and received her Ph.D. in History of American Civilization from Harvard. Dr. Skårdal is well known for her book, *The Divided Heart*, which, "discusses the complex psychological and sociological processes through which Norwegians, Swedes, and Danes turned from Europeans to Americans."

Thorvald Hansen, a past contributor to *The Bridge*, is editor of *Church and Life*, a monthly periodical published by the Danish Interest Conference of the Lutheran Church of America. Rev.
