OBITUARY

Han-Chu Huang, 69, who retired in 1990 as a librarian in the Oriental and Chinese section of the Library of Congress, died of cancer November 2, 1991 at his home in Silver Spring, Maryland. A Library of Congress employee for twenty-six years, he previously worked in its law library and American intelligence division.

Mr. Huang was born in China's Zhejiang province. He came to the United States in 1948 to be third attaché at the embassy of the Republic of China. He was a graduate of George Washington University.

Survivors include his wife, Shuh-Wei Huang of Silver Spring; two children, Ann Huang of Great Falls, Maryland, and Byron Huang of Silver Spring; a sister, Helen Huang of Santa Barbara, California; and three grandchildren.
