## Contributors to This Issue

Christian Poul Christiansen (later Christian Paul Christianson) was born on his parents' farm of Havgaard near the village of Hvejsel in Jutland on 26 October 1832. He emigrated to America in 1868 and settled in southern Hamilton County, Iowa, where he and his son helped to found the town of Randall in 1878.

Dr. C. P. Peterson was born in Lindeballe parish, Jutland, on 13 February 1867, attended Askov Folk School, and emigrated to Randall, Iowa, in 1888. After several years of bumming around the West, he completed the buttermaking course at Iowa State College in Ames and worked at various Iowa creameries from 1895 until 1900. Then he entered Keokuk Dental College, where he graduated with the D. D. S. degree in 1903. He settled with his family in Mankato, Minnesota, where he practiced dentistry for fifty years and wrote his autobiography in English in the year 1938.
