Contributors to This Issue

Kristian Tybjerg is a grandson of Jutta Sørensen, the daughter who was left behind when Kathrine and Corfix Sørensen emigrated to America in 1889. Tybjerg lived in Hirtshals in 1982, when he drew upon a rich family archive of America letters to publish the story of his American great-grandparents and their descendants.

Inger M. Olsen is a graduate of Haslev Teacher's College in Denmark and Portland State University in Oregon, where she is Adjunct Assistant Professor and has taught Danish since 1980. She has published articles and translations in the USA and Denmark. Besides participating in professional conferences, she helps to plan the NWDCC Menucha Conference at Corbett, Oregon.

Magne Kjems and Hjalmar Kjems were sons of Mariane and Simon Kjems. They lived in Ashland, Michigan, from 1891-97 and returned to Denmark after the death of their father to settle in Fredericia. Hjalmar was the oldest, born in 1878, and Magne was born in 1882. Both of them spent their adult lives in Denmark but wrote memoirs of their happy boyhood days in America.
