A little pig has found a stick that he (or she--the gender is indiscriminate) then pretends is various other things. The easy text alternates between a grown-up's voice ("Watch where you point that stick.") and a child's insistence that what he is playing with is "not a stick."

Portis' *Not a Box* was brilliant and innovative, but *Not a Stick* is simply a variation on the same theme. While the book may be used for exercises in imagination or for learning how to predict, overall it is lackluster and derivative.

Fourteen children's book illustrators, including Tomie DePaola, Sophie Blackall, Brett Helquist, Yumi Heo, Peter H. A young Iraqi boy, Ali, lives with his family, plays soccer, and studies in Baghdad. His passion is learning to write beautiful Arabic letters. Their gliding, sweeping, leaping movements allow him to hear the silent music in his head and remind him of watching a soccer game in slow motion. He leaves messages for his father on the bathroom mirror, and his mother compares his to the famous calligrapher Yakut. During the 2003 night bombings of Baghdad, Ali writes all night to soothe himself and continues to write to bring peace to his mind.

Rumford's use of Ali's point of view allows readers insights into the often unseen lives children who must learn to cope with war as they are growing up. The focus is on daily life and not on the politics of war. Photographs posted on the Internet inspired the computer-enhanced pencil and charcoal illustrations. Rumford also penned much of the calligraphy.

The general fascination with the high-risk exploits of thrill-seekers has fueled entertainment for centuries. Cummins uses this fascination to craft a collective biography of 14 female performers whose daring deeds inspired awe in turn-of-the-20th-century spectators. From human cannonball to bareback rider to barnstormer to tiger-trainer to stunt driver, these women preferred derring-do to the traditional role of women of their day. A two-page chronology of the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries notes the accomplishments of selected women in America.

Cummins' sources and acknowledgements document her research. Harness's gauche and pen illustrations capture these women's exploits, but period photographs--where available--would have added realism to the text. A combination of illustrations and photographs could have strengthened the book. In an era of extreme sports and reality television, these women's stunts may seem too tame for some young readers; however, others will be amazed at their daring. Rappaport's *Living Dangerously: American Women Who Risked their Lives for Adventure* (1991), which focuses on 20th century women, would be a useful companion to *Women Daredevils*.

Authors Murrie and Murrie have collected attention-grabbing miscellany from more than 65 websites, government agencies, and industries and arranged the brief informational blurbs into eight chapters dealing with earth, space, the human body, technology, animals, food, pop culture, and sports. Each blurb contains about 70-150 words that can be read in about one minute and is accompanied by a simple two-color illustration.

Every Minute on Earth is an ideal commuter, dining table, or bathroom reader. For families who have difficulty finding 15 minutes to read together, this book encourages one and two minute reading sessions that help cultivate intellectual curiosity. An intriguing choice for trivia hounds, budding geniuses, and reluctant readers.

The twelve-year-old protagonist of Paulsen's *Lawn Boy* doesn't want much in the beginning--just a new inner tube for his old ten speed bicycle. But when his slightly batty grandmother gives him his grandfather's old riding mower, he keeps getting more and more lawns to mow. When he meets Arnold, a stockbroker who exchanges stock for mowing, he suddenly is running his own business, employing adults, and sponsoring a prizefighter. All of this comes in handy when someone tries to extort money from him by kidnapping Arnold.

Paulsen's usual straightforward style becomes slightly muddy but holds up in his latest book. *Lawn Boy* is clearly written in the same vein as *The Toothpaste Millionaire*, with a child using industriousness and outright luck to become financially successful. The lawn boy has mostly luck instead of Millionaire's Rufus's math skills and pragmatism, but the results were still positive and well-earned. Teachers and librarians can find accompanying teaching information by going to a website listed on the publication page at the front of the book. A great book for inspiring children to be industrious, and a good starting point to explain how the market economy works.

David is nine and angry because his mother has died. Primrose is thirteen and angry because her mother is “goofy” and thinks she’s psychic. David believes if he obeys all the rules, perhaps his mother will come back. Primrose thinks rules are made to be broken. They seem to be the last two people who could be friends, but they have a strange bond between them, built of dissatisfaction, fear and need. As the summer progresses, they gather trash to sell at the flea market, hunt for worms to start a bait business, go to the library’s Midsummer Night’s Scream as son and mom, and end up trying to walk the railroad tracks to Philadelphia. They learn that being friends means forgiving each other, staying together, and putting arms around each other when it’s really needed.

Jerry Spinelli writes beautifully of children who are struggling with loss, pain and — ultimately — healing. David “still heard his mother’s voice rise like whisper-dust from unseen corners in the house, but it was no longer the only voice he heard. His ears were also filled with the voices of others ... all their words for a thousand years could not fill the hole left by his mother, but they could raise a loving fence around it so he didn’t keep falling in.” This is a sweet book, easy to read, with short chapters and real heart.

Framed by Ashley, her so called best friend, for a cheating ring, Bernetta Wallflower is grounded for the whole summer and not allowed to assist her father in his magic club. Having lost her scholarship Bernetta resolves to earn the \$9,000 she needs to return to her private school. When no one will hire a twelve year old, Bernetta thinks all hope is lost until a chocolate-brown eyed boy named Gabe convinces her to join him running simple con games. Desperate for the money she joins Gabe and everything goes smoothly until Ashley reenters the picture and steals their money, thus forcing the two friends to take her down with an elaborate con. An extremely unique premise gives this novel an interesting plot. Bernetta is a sympathetic character that readers will understand. However the many plot elements and character actions end up being so unbelievable that the whole package loses credibility in the end. Even her magic training in her favor, it is too hard to accept that twelve year olds could get away with cons after having only learned them from movies and books. In addition it is hard to accept that Bernetta could so easily put aside all the moral, ethical, and legal issues surrounding the endeavor. The return of Ashley and her previous involvement with Gabe is also implausible and her ultimate downfall is unsatisfying. In the end the implausibility of the events prevent this book from being a satisfying read.

The lass, a last and unwanted child by her mother, is not given a name. She bonds and works with her older brother Hans Peter when he returns from a chilling adventure. She discovers that she understands the language of animals. When an isbjørner, ice bear, offers wealth to her family in return for her staying with him for a year in a palace, she and her pet wolf accompany him to find enchantment and mystery as she unravels the secrets of the ice palace.

Based on the Norse tale, *East of the Sun and West of the Moon*, this fantasy reads easily and interestingly, adding creative details to the original story. Those who enjoyed Hale's *Goose Girl* (2003) and *Enna Burning* (2004) will find this novel equally appealing.

Shipped off to live with his archeologist dad for the summer, Matt arrives only to find his father has mysteriously disappeared. Finding and decoding a secret message sets Matt out on a mysterious adventure to discover the hidden treasure that his father was tracking. Aided by his Aunt Jane and her enigmatic employer Julius Venture and his equally mysterious daughter Robin, Matt travels around the globe to uncover ancient secrets that will either change or destroy the world. A Franciscan friary in medieval Italy seems an unlikely place for a series of violent deaths, the budding of a young love, and renewal of an old one, yet so it is in Mary Hoffman's *The Falconer's Knot*. How the title relates to the action is somewhat obscure; *Murder in the Monastery* might have been more descriptive of the novel's focus. Sixteen-year-old Silvano, a "counterfeit" friar, is secretly given sanctuary at the Giardinetto friary while his father, the Baron Montacuto, searches for the fugitive who used Silvano's dagger to kill a man. Unfortunately, the sanctuary becomes almost more dangerous than remaining in his home city.

Adjacent to the friary is a small convent, where an unwilling young girl is sent by her brother/guardian upon their father's death. Chiara must lose her name, her beautiful hair, and all worldly possessions as she dons the robes of a novice nun. She notices, however, the arrival of the handsome, young friar with interest; the grisly events that unfold draw them increasingly together. Many lives are lost or endangered before the mysteries are finally solved and the true killers identified. The way is open at last for blossoming love to move toward a satisfying "happy ever after," with all of the side plots neatly tied together.

Fans of mystery and romance will find Hoffman's story intriguingly different, mainly due to the time period and unusual setting. Unfortunately, the pace is slowed by several sub-plots which introduce a multiplicity of characters (some of them actual historical Italian artists), though Hoffman does provide a character list which helps to keep them straight. The novel also detours into Italian art history, the chemistry and technique of color preparation for fresco painting, and descriptions of various walls and ceilings being decorated. Some readers may become a little impatient waiting for the story to move forward; others with an interest in art may welcome the painting asides. Once again, the author assists with a historical note which provides background information on medieval Italian art and lifestyle. Additionally, an outline of the Divine Office helps clarify numerous references to the daily routine at the friary and nunnery. The colorful dust jacket, simulating vellum, with gold foil "illuminations" added to its illustrations, reflects the medieval setting and invites readers into its pages. Though not a gripping novel, *The Falconer's Knot* is entertaining and does give the persistent reader an interesting glimpse into medieval Italian culture.

Fifteen year old Sparrow Delaney has been seeing, hearing, and even smelling ghosts since she was five years old (a fact which she has hidden from her family--all of whom manifest some sort of mediumistic ability), but all she wants is to live a normal life. She seizes the opportunity to attend a different high school than her six older sisters and attempts to fit in, ignoring the advice of her three spirit guides and doing her best to not notice the ghostly teenage boy she sees on her first day. The boy however is most persistent, and Sparrow will have to accept the talent that she has in order to help a new friend.

Harper's debut novel is a coming-of-age story with a skillfully woven supernatural element. The ghosts and the special talents of the psychics in the book are not ostentatiously displayed but treated as a fact of life, lending an air of believability. However, the storyline and Sparrow's character development are both rather predictable. Harper wraps this story up nicely but leaves enough unanswered--the truth behind Sparrow's father's disappearance and the question of what she will do now that she has exposed her abilities in a very public manner--to possibly write a sequel. A sweet, if somewhat insubstantial, teen read.

Through the settings, characters, and authors of various multicultural books, all readers can achieve a greater understanding of the varying cultures represented. Although multicultural literature can be a powerful and positive teacher, much depends on the views and writing of the author. It is important to critically analyze the purpose for and validity of the cultures being represented in the story as one is reading.

Below is a selection of multicultural literature books, published between 2002 and 2007, available in the Harold B. Lee Library. The majority of books chosen for this bibliography are fiction.
