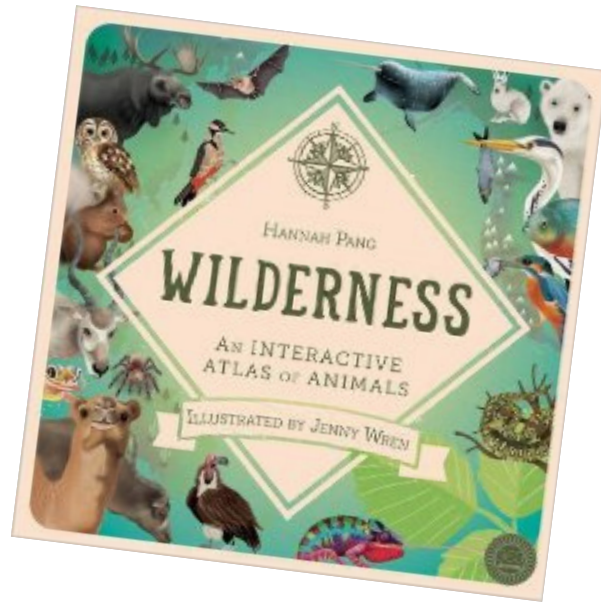

Explore the amazing world of animals with this interactive book. Discover the panther chameleon in the rain forest, the sociable weaver bird of the savanna, and many other animals of the six main habitats. Each habitat introduces a bunch of animals and some little known facts about them.

While this book doesn't have many pages in it, the ones it has are more than sufficient. Each of the six habitats has at least two pages filled with multiple animals and information about them. There are flaps to lift, wheels to spin, and pop ups to interact with. Every page is incredibly illustrated with colorful images of animals and the environment they live in. The information included on the animals is short, only a couple sentences each, but is very interesting and even animal aficionados will learn a lot from this book.
