There are three different sections that are about predators, prey, and animal eating habits. Each is full of fun and interesting facts about a wide variety of animals.

This book lacks any kind of introduction or common narrative. The collection of facts are related, but no conclusions are drawn from similarities or differences they might have. This book is an exceedingly poor learning tool and only functions as a somewhat random distribution of animal facts. This makes it very difficult to read more than a few pages at a time. The animal facts are fascinating and will, almost assuredly, get kids excited about animals. The pictures in the book are also well done and a nice addition to the rather long book.
