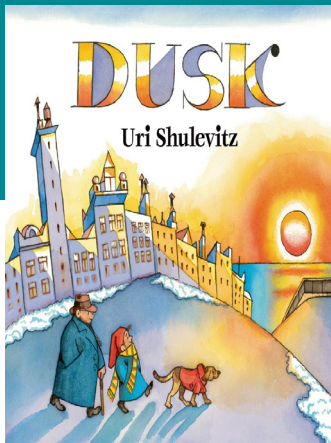

As the sun goes down, they head back to the city and notice all types of people scurrying about for their holiday shopping. Soon the city lights come on, one by one, highlighting the holiday festivities for Christmas, Hanukkah, and Kwanzaa. The city lights are as bright and cheerful as day.

This simple picture book demonstrates types of light and ways to celebrate. The bold, colorful pictures contrast the light and shadows at dusk.
