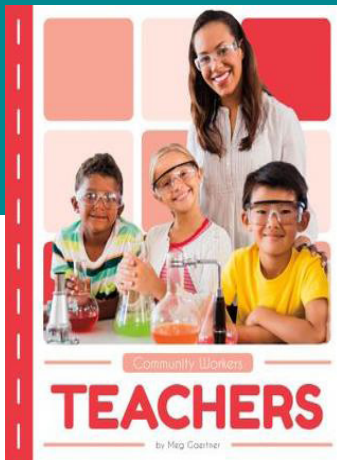
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Book Review

The activities available online for students have to be downloaded and printed out, which can be tedious. A child who reads this book most likely knows this material based on their school experiences. This book would be most useful when used with the entire series and possibly for comparing and contrasting community workers' responsibilities.
