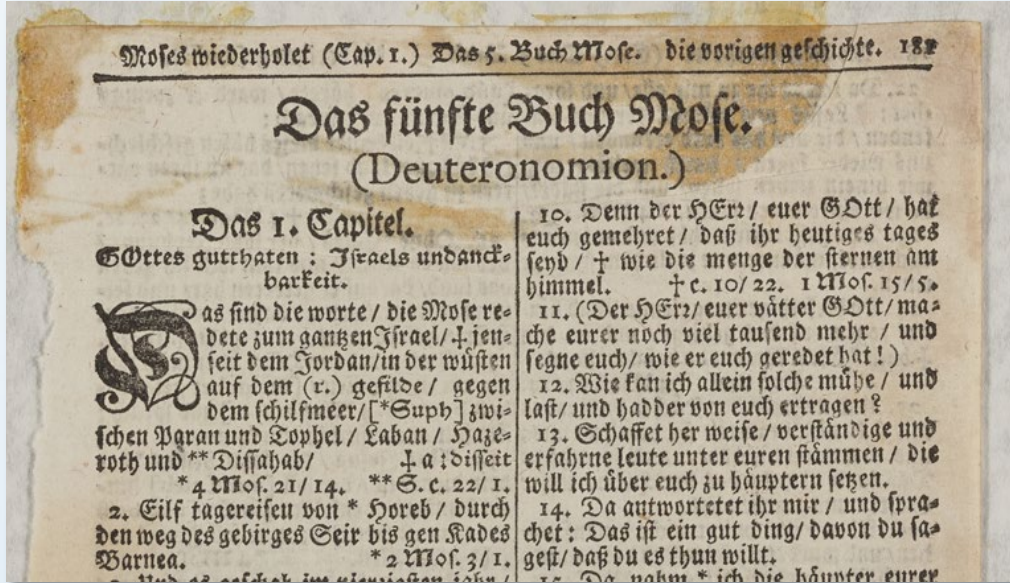

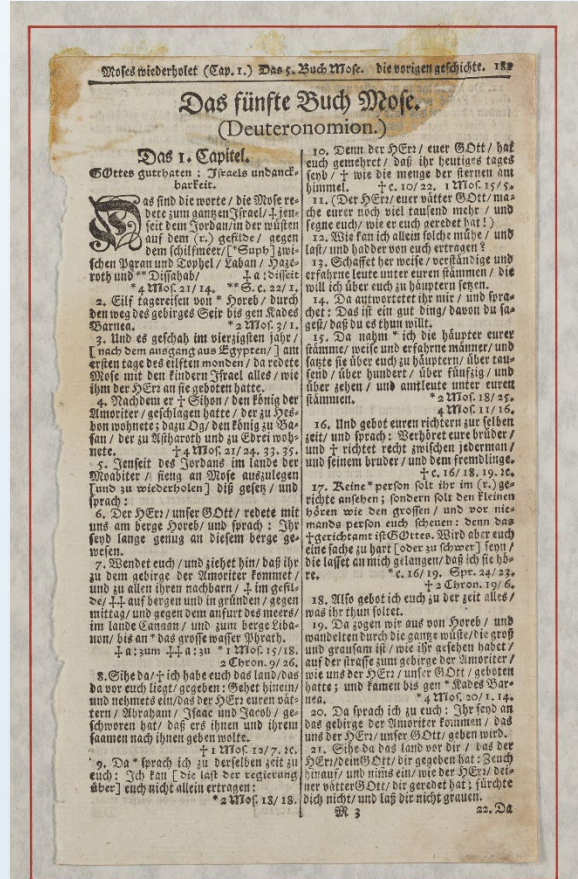

BATHING.

We wish to caution all the boys who go to Playa beach to bathe, to beware of the undertow. It is very strong and one soldier has already lost his life by venturing too far out.

We saw five soldiers bringing in a comrade the other day, and they had the utmost difficulty in landing him safe.

INDIANA'S MONUMENT

The 161st Indiana's monument to those of its members who have succumbed to small pox is about completed. Several of the boys contracted the disease while nursing friends who had it.

Too much credit cannot be given boys who will so unselfishly risk their own life for the benefit of another.

It is not too much to say, that if at any future day Cuban or Spaniard should desecrate this pile, our country would spend millions to avenge the insult.

THE TWO BANDS.

At Dress Parade the other evening, the 2d and 1st regiments, marching in line between them and the 1st N. C. This brought the two bands within 25 yards of each other, and when they both got in motion at the same time, the earth trembled as if an earthquake were doing business.

TWO FRIENDS.

They had from different sections of our common country, but this war has made them one. They are the 4th Virginia and 49th Iowa. What was thought impossible has come to pass. Start something with an Iowa boy and you are liable to get your beatings from a member of the Old Dominion.

Dishonorable Discharges.

Since arriving in Cuba several of the boys have received dishonorable discharges.

Such a discharge turns a soldier loose in a foreign land without a cent in his pocket. He receives no pay, clothing allowance, transportation or ration money.

To the boys' credit be it said, they usually take up a collection for such an unfortunate, and in this way he is enabled to get back to his home in the States with a few dollars to help him buy a suit of clothes, etc.

This sentence is pronounced by a Court Martial and is intended as a punishment to the culprit and also as a warning to others who are inclined to loiter lightly on the Articles of War.

CUBAN CAMP CLIPPINGS

This is to introduce to the people of Cuba the only military paper in the U. S. Army. It enjoys wide circulation in America, where it was called The Brigade Review. Now that we are in Cuba we change its name to conform to our new surroundings, and here it will be known as the Cuban Camp Clippings.

It is published every Saturday, and reaches all American soldiers in Cuba, besides circulating very largely among civilians.

Private Masquere, of Co. H, gave a spread in his tent the other day, consisting of sardines and aguardiente, to several members of his company, notably Private Saxe, better known as "Rough Rider," through the combination of fire water and journalism served up at the feast, he is now toying with the rock pile.

Company H has lost two of its most valued members. Private Geo. Kreamer has been discharged and Private Maxson has been transferred to the Signal Corps.

The First Battalion, under Capt. C. C. Fredericks, returned this morning from a six day practice march, having covered about 120 miles through about a dozen small towns, the principal ones of which were San José, Jesús del Monte, and Guamas, which was the objective point of the march. The boys were accompanied by the regimental band. They were given a warm reception by the Cubans along the route and overjoyed to strike camp, where they could get some relief from the saltness that was fed to them on the march.

Privates Wilder and Pete, of Co. H, have resigned their positions in the kitchen.

There was an election held in Co. M, a few days ago to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Lieut. Poncet. 2nd Lt. Geo. Bladone was elected first lieutenant, and Sergeant-Major Montgomery was elected second lieutenant.

There were a number of promotions in Co. G lately. Sergeants L. N. du Triel and R. D. Aguen were promoted, respectively from third and fourth sergeants to second and third. Corporals Conitt and Linnock were made sergeants, and Privates Breen and Trisconi were made corporals.

The bugler of Co. H, Robert Rohr, together with the buglers from Cos. A and K, went down to the bay the other day and took a bath, and since then the natives have discovered all sorts of dead fishes in the waters thereof.

Bugler Beck, of Co. E, will spend a few days in the guard house. He says he is stuck on the rock pile.

Sergeant Rankin, of Co. H, was appointed Sgt. Major recently, and D. K. Harvey and Twin are now rivals for the position.

Our First Battalion marched into camp just 36 hours ahead of the famous 4th Illinois and the glorious 3rd Nebraska.

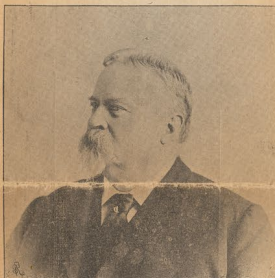

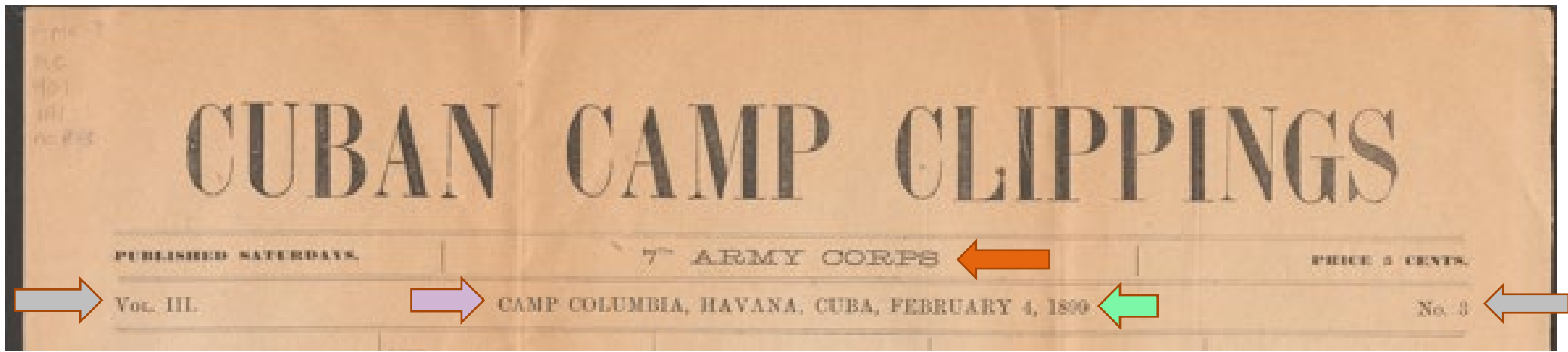

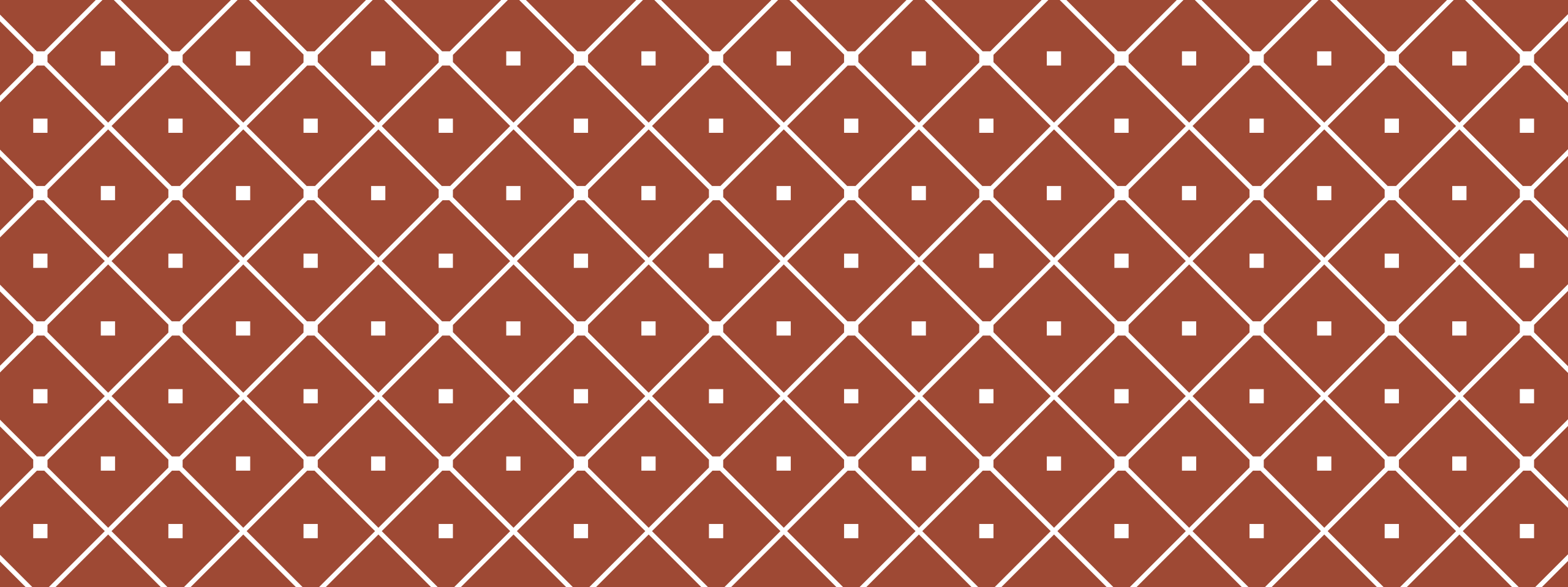
