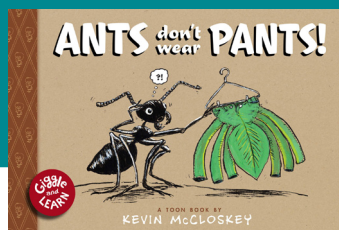

This book is full of information that would interest young ant enthusiasts.

This book would be a fantastic read for children who are interested in insects. It makes learning fun by showing information visually that readers often only get as text. The acrylic illustrations flow perfectly with the text, showing exactly what is described. This is also a fine resource for teachers or parents; however, they should be aware that some pictures are a little graphic, showing ants exploding and shutting their jaws on other insects.
