

Written with brevity suitable for young learners, the contents are well organized and aesthetically pleasing. Bold font is used to identify each species, and some of the print appears in soft warm colors to match the photos. At the end, there is additional information that will prove useful for research projects and individual personal interests. This is an ideal resource for upper-elementary school science classrooms and libraries. It's also perfect as a coffee table centerpiece due to its eye-catching qualities and overall allure.
